MINUTES OF A NOMINATION MEETING HELD AT ST MARY'S PARISH HALL On 12th February 2020 AT 8PM

Pursuant to a certain Act of the Royal Court, dated 24th January 2020, it was ordered that an election be held on 11th March 2020 to fill the following Parish offices:

- Procureur du Bien Public for a 3 year term of office expiring March 2023
- Centenier for a 3 year term of office expiring March 2023

Pursuant to Article 19 of the Public Elections (Jersey) Law 2002, Notice was given that a Nomination Meeting of the Electors of the Parish of St Mary would be held at St Mary's Parish Hall on Wednesday 12th February at 8pm and 8.15pm respectively to proceed with the said nomination in conformity with the aforesaid Act of the Royal Court.

The Connétable, John Le Bailly, opened the meeting by welcoming all. Apologies were received from David Munns and Jim Drew. The Parish Secretary read the Notice convening the meeting.

The meeting was attended by 20 people who were eligible to vote.

The Connétable advised the Assembly the office of Procureur du Bien Public has become available due to the current term of office expiring. This office has been held by Derek Maltwood since 2007 and prior to this office Derek served as Deputy for the Parish from 1987 to 2002. Due to ill health he is now retiring. A Vin d'Honneur will be held at a later date to thank Derek for his service to the Parish.

The Connétable advised that one nomination paper for this office has been received from Paul Ashworth. The nomination was proposed by Daniel Reed who advised the Assembly that Paul had lived in the Parish for 15 years and has previously served the Parish as a Constable's Officer for 7 years and also helped with the Battle of Flowers float for 3 years. Paul is a qualified accountant and banker currently working in the Parish.

The nomination was seconded by John Alcock, Anne Proffitt, Glynn Bower, Kerry Bower, Paul Wilkinson, Rachel Noel, Philip Guthrie, Fiona Godel, and Nicky Alcock. A vote was requested by a show of hands. The result was unanimously agreed. As no further nominations were received the Connétable congratulated Paul and declared him Procureur du Bien Public and warned Paul to appear before the Royal Court on Friday 13th March 2020 at 10am to be sworn in.

The Connétable advised the Assembly the office of Centenier had become vacant due to the expiry of Centenier Alcock's current term of office. The Connétable advised he had received one nomination paper from John Alcock for this office. The Connétable stated that Centenier Alcock joined St Mary Honorary Police in December 2008 as Constable's Officer, an office he served until February 2011. John has been serving the office of Centenier since February 2011 – this would be his fourth term of office. He thanked John for serving the Parish superbly and with great experience. The nomination was proposed by Christopher Bunt who stated that John is a stalwart of St Mary and works invaluable in the background with the States of Jersey Police and stated long may his long service continue.

The nomination was seconded by Paul Ashworth, Nicky Parker, Stephen Parker, Caroline Ashworth, Anne Proffitt, Alison Dryland, Graham Dryland, Sarah Reed and Leanne Reed. A vote was requested by a show of hands. The result was unanimously agreed. As no further nominations were received the Connétable congratulated John and declared him duly re-elected to the office of Centenier. He then warned John to appear before the Royal Court on Friday 13th March 2020 at 10am to be sworn in.

The Connétable declared the meeting closed at 8.30pm.
